### From Our Principal ... .....



As we enter our last month of school, I want to thank our Kenrose community for all the support that you have provided to our school and our teachers during the 2012 -13 school year! Special thanks to the Kenrose PTO and its leadership for all of your efforts this year! We appreciate all that you do!

For students in grades 3-5, final preparations begin this week for the Tennessee Comprehensive Assessment Program (TCAP) assessment, which will begin this Friday. Following is a review of information that has already been communicated to Kenrose parents of 3<sup>rd</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> grade students.

TCAP dates are as follows: Friday, April 26 (Reading); Monday, April 29 (Math); Wednesday, May 1 (Science); and Thursday, May 2 (Social Studies). Tuesday, April 30, and Friday, May 4<sup>th</sup>, are make -up days for students who have missed assessments due to illness.

As determined by state law, the TCAP assessment counts as a percentage of the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester grade for students in grades 3-5. In Williamson County Schools this percentage is 15%. Absences of all students who miss any TCAP

exams (and do not take them on make-up days) will be reviewed by a WCS district office committee to determine the consequence of the absence. Parents of students who miss TCAP must provide an excuse note to the school including information you deem important regarding why your child was absent (doctor's notes, etc.). The committee will determine the result of the absence. which will be one of the following grade consequences: 1) Grade "Incomplete"; 2) Excused Absence (no grade consequence); or 3) Unexcused Absence - 0 (zero) averaged into the second semester grade in place of the 15% TCAP score. If your child is ill and must miss a TCAP assessment, please contact the school office as soon as possible; hopefully, all missed tests can be taken care of on make-up days.

The levels of performance on TCAP as reported by the state are as follows: advanced (superior mastery of grade level standards), proficient (mastery of grade level standards), basic (partial mastery of grade level standards), and below basic (less than partial mastery of grade level standards). In accordance with TN state law, students who score "Below Ba-

sic" in 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade Reading must participate in a summer intervention before promotion to 4<sup>th</sup> grade will be granted.

Our teachers and students have worked hard all year to ensure that students have learned the curriculum and are well prepared to demonstrate their learning on TCAP. Parents can assist by taking extra care to make sure students come to school well rested and eat a healthy breakfast on TCAP days. We have a "Rock the Test!" theme at school. We want students to understand that TCAP is important and want to do well, but not to feel undue pressure. Our goal is simply to encourage students to do their best to show their learning. Thank you for your support of this goal!

Once again, thank you for your support as we head into the home stretch of the school year. Although the bulk of this letter has been about TCAP, I want to assure you that teaching and learning will continue at Kenrose through the end of the school year!

TCAP TESTING: April 26th, April 29th, May 1st and May 2nd

In 3<sup>rd</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> grade *Life Skills*, our classroom guidance curriculum, we are focusing on strategies to emotionally support TCAP preparation. We are highlighting the importance of personal effort, confidence and maintaining a positive attitude. So a consistent message can be heard from home, here are some additional tips for supporting your child or children during the important week ahead:

#### **TIPS FOR PARENTS**

- See that your child is rested and eats breakfast the day of the test.
- See that your child arrives to school on time and is relaxed.
- Discuss the test openly and in a positive way.
- Have realistic expectations of your child's performance while encouraging his/her best efforts.
- Emphasize that the test is only one measure of academic performance.
- Emphasize that test scores do not determine a person's worth.
- Do not send your child to school if illness is apparent.
- Do not remove your child from school on test days for appointments.

## **New Library Books**







#### Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day

Keep Williamson Beautiful, Williamson County Solid Waste Department and the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation have scheduled the Williamson County Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day event for Saturday, May 4, 2013 at the Williamson County Administrative Complex parking lot. This location is 1320 West Main Street in Franklin. The collection event will be held between the hours of 8:30 AM and 2:00 PM.

This is a good way to dispose of household hazardous waste in a safe way. Start preparing for the event today by looking around in your closets, basement, garage, cabinets, and outbuildings to see what you need to dispose of at the event. You can also bring household hazardous waste for your friends and relatives who

cannot attend.

What to bring: All households are invited to participate. Items that will be accepted include: paint thinners, automotive fluids, pesticides and herbicides, oven cleaners and drain cleaners, swimming pool chemicals, roofing tar, aerosols, and driveway sealant.

Items not accepted: BOPAE: Batteries, Oil, Paint, Antifreeze, and Electronics will not be accepted at the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day. These are accepted year round at 417 Century Court by the City of Franklin Department of Solid event or other recycling and litter preven-Waste Monday - Friday from 6:30 a.m. -2:00 p.m. No explosives, radioactive materials, medical waste, or commercial wastes will be accepted.

How to bring it: Line your trunk with plastic or newspaper. Store all hazardous materials in closed containers. Containers with original labels are preferable. If the material is unknown please give the attendants working the event as much information about it as possible.


Upon arriving at the event, please stay in your vehicle and allow the contractors to empty your trunk of hazardous wastes. This will keep traffic moving steadily and wait time down to a minimum.
