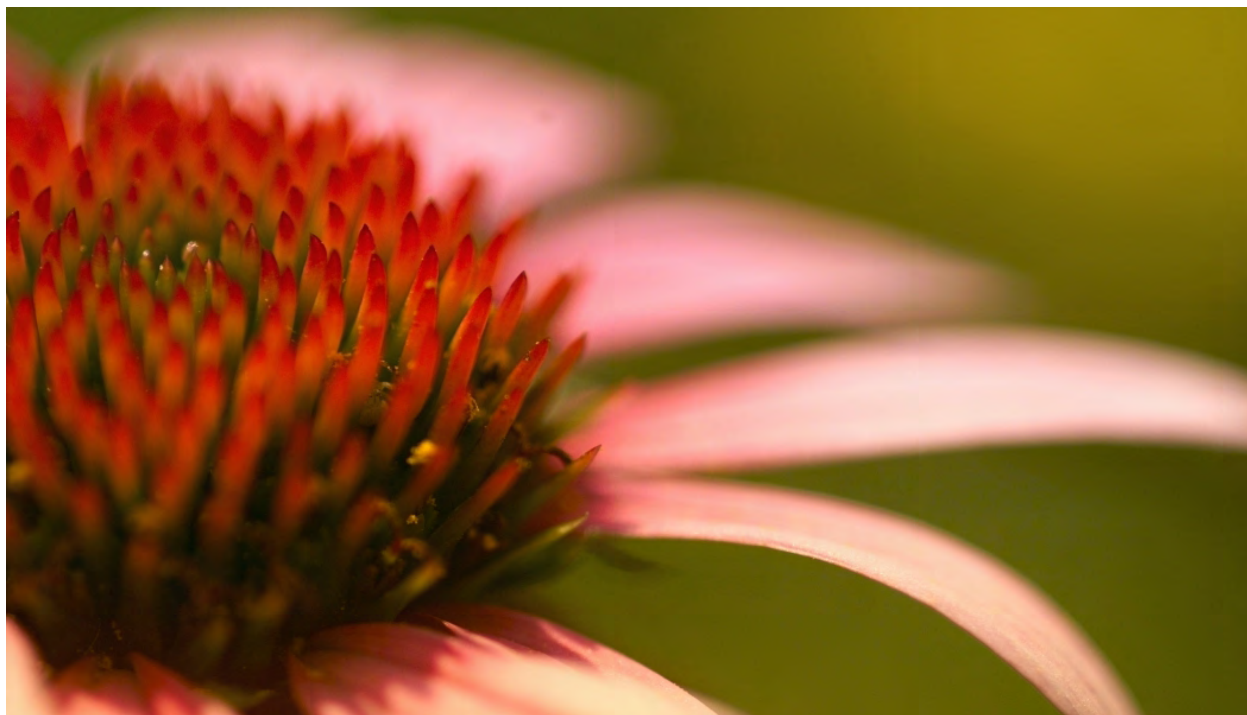

5. **Select your child's grade for next year** and complete the order.

6. Your child's supplies will be waiting for them in their classroom on the first day of school with no worries!
