**More Details:

 - 2. **OR** create a full-color cover with original artwork. Artwork should be drawn on an unlined white sheet of paper, not exceeding 11"x14" in size.

Williamson County youth are invited to compete for monetary awards in the General Federation of Women's Clubs (GFWC) poetry and short story contests announced today by the local club: GFWC Brentwood Woman's Club. Contest guidelines are posted on the Brentwood Woman's Club web-site, www.bwctn.org and printed guidelines are located at the Brentwood, Williamson County, and Spring Hill libraries. **Deadline for submissions is October 15 2013**. Electronic submissions to bwctn964@gmail.com are preferred in a Microsoft Word document format for the poetry and short story entries. Entries will be accepted at the Brentwood library, also.

Winners will be announced December 2. Winning entries will be submitted for competition at the GFWC Music City District, State, and International levels culminating in the announcement of the GFWC International winners at our International Convention in July, 2014.

According to local club president, Liz Martin, "GFWC Brentwood has been privileged to have three past International winners in our poetry contest. Local resident Sarah Lebvre, high school student at Ravenwood High School, won 1st place in the state competition this spring as a result of our first sponsored short story writing contest last fall."

RULES FOR POETRY & SHORT STORIES

- 1. Contestants must reside in Williamson County, may be public, private, or home-schooled students.
- 2. Entries must be typed, double-spaced, printed on one side only with minimum margins of 1-inch on all 4 sides of $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" sheet(s).
- 3. Entries must be written during the contest year (January 1 October 15, 2013).
- 4. Entries must have the following on the top right hand corner of each page.
 - a. Author's name
 - a. Address (street and city)
 - b. Telephone number
 - c. Email address
 - d. Name of school & Category Level
 - e. List club sponsor General Federation of Women's Club, Williamson Co. TN
 - f. Title of your work
- 5. Originals will not be returned. Authors should retain a copy.
- 6. Rules must be strictly enforced due to the large volume of entries.
- 7. Entries of poems can be any style, with a minimum length of eight lines and a maximum of 50 lines.
- 8. Entries of short stories are limited to 2,000 words.
- 9. One entry for Poetry and/or Short Story Contest.

Grade Level Categories:

Category I - Grades K, 1 and 2 Category II - Grades 3, 4 and 5 Category III - Grades 6, 7 and 8 Category IV - Grades 9, 10, 11 and 12

Cash awards in poetry and short stories contest in each category:

1st place \$100. 2nd place \$ 50. 3rd place \$ 25.

Winning entries will be entered in district, state, and international contests with a signed GFWC Creative Arts Waiver required from students or parents (students under 18) at the formal acceptance for publication by the General Federation of Women's Clubs.

Electronic submissions to bwctn964@gmail.com are preferred in a Microsoft Word document format for the poetry and short story entries. Entries will be accepted at the Brentwood and Spring Hill libraries, also.
