The Scholastic Book Fair will officially open for business in the KES Library on Thursday, October 24th and will run until 9:30 a.m. the following Friday (November 1st).

Students will be allowed to "preview" (no sales) the book fair on October 22nd or 23rd. Students may choose to write down titles and prices of books they are interested in.

So when can parents and students shop at the Book Fair?

- 1. Students will visit the Book Fair when their class has library for specials between Thursday, October 24 and Thursday, October 31st. There are a couple of exceptions to this due to field trips and fall parties. Please see the schedule for more information. *PLEASE NOTE: MRS. KON, MRS. SMITHSON AND MRS. MOSER ARE NOT LISTED. THE STUDENTS IN THOSE CLASSES ARE SPLIT AMONG THE OTHER CLASSES IN THEIR GRADE FOR SPECIALS. THEY WILL COME TO BOOK FAIR WITH THAT CLASS.* Parents may opt to send money with their students and allow their child to shop on their own. You are also welcome to join your child at the library and shop with them. *Please know that Mrs. Breece will be showing a video or have some other activity for those students who do not wish to shop or may have already done so/or are doing it at another time.*
- 2. **Parents** are also welcome to come on their own anytime during the school day, simply by signing in as a visitor in the office.
- 3. Teachers may choose to allow individual students to the library to shop at book fair throughout the week as allowed by their schedule. Students must first report to their classrooms in the morning, as the book fair will not be open before school.
- 4. We host a "Family Night" On **Thursday, October 24th** where we stay open until 7 pm. This is a great opportunity for families to visit the book fair together.
- 5. Finally, we open at 7:30 a.m. on Thursday, October 31st and Friday, November 1st during the "Donuts for Dad" event.

All proceeds from Book Fair are used for purchasing new books and other library equipment. Thank you!

Uniform items are always greatly appreciated (solid collared shirts and khaki or navy pants). Please consider purchasing a new pair of shoes, package of underwear or socks or a uniform for a child at Glenview. It is an excellent opportunity to have your child experience the joy of giving. We always seem to run short on boy's sizes 6-10 so if you purchase new items, please consider these sizes. Backpacks and accessories are needed as well. If purchasing new shoes, sizes 13-4 are the greatest need.

The clothing drive dates are October 31 - November 5 with delivery on November 6. All donations are tax deductible, receipts available at collection or by request.

3rd - 5th grade students and parent volunteers who participate in collection may attend the distribution day at Glenview. This is a wonderful opportunity for your children to serve others. The kids who attend distribution day work hard all day and leave more mindful of the needs of others.
