The average child gets less than 15 minutes a day of vigorous physical activity. Help your youngster achieve the recommended 60 minutes every day by keeping track. Hang a calendar on the kitchen wall, and have each person write in the physical activities they did that day (walked the dog, played football).

For the safety of our children and for efficiency, please review the following procedures for car riders for morning arrival and for afternoon dismissal. We ask for your cooperation by adhering to the following procedures.

Morning Arrival Please do not exceed 15 mph in any area of the school campus!

- 1. Pull up as far as you can in the **RIGHT LANE ONLY**.
- 2. Be sure to keep the driveway clear so that buses pass through to the bus lane/exit the campus.
- 3. Encourage your child/children to have all backpacks and materials ready so that they may exit the car quickly.
- 4. A safety patrol student will be on duty to assist as needed. Students should exit vehicles from the RIGHT SIDE ONLY. Wait for your child to be safely on the sidewalk before moving your car. Please encourage your child to walk close to the building and not along the sidewalk near the moving cars.
- 5. Remain in the right hand lane to slowly exit the drop off line. **DO NOT PASS ON THE LEFT!**
- 6. **Refrain from using your cell phone for any purpose during the arrival process.** This is unsafe for the children as well as the staff members and students who are on duty.
- 7. Do not pull into any parking space and send your child to the crosswalk unattended. On a limited, as needed basis, if you need to walk your child into the school, you should park in a designated space and walk them all the way into the building. Only park in the handicapped space with proper documentation.
- 8. Follow directives of crossing guards and staff members. Watch for children at all times!

Arrival will be quick and efficient if everyone adheres to these procedures. Most importantly, we will be certain that all children arrive safely. Thank you in advance for your cooperation!

Afternoon Dismissal Please do not exceed 15 mph in any area of the school campus!

- 1. Do not instruct your child to dismiss as a "down the hill walker" and load into your car in the neighborhood.
- 2. Pull up as far as you can in one of the three rows that will be formed.
- 3. Do not park in the parking lot and walk across traffic to pick up your child. Do not ask your child to walk into the parking lot to meet you.
- 4. No child will be allowed to go to vehicles beyond the end of the sidewalk near the flagpole. If your car is beyond the sidewalk, stay in your car and wait for the line to move forward.
- 5. Turn your engine **OFF** when students are present and do not restart until you are given the signal to do so.
- 6. Stay in or beside your car. Do not come to the sidewalk to meet your child. We will help your child locate you, if needed.
- 7. All children will receive a signal from a Kenrose staff member when it is time to load in the vehicles. Please do not motion for your child to come to you before this signal is given. Cars you cannot see may still be moving.
- 8. **NEVER LEAVE YOUR CAR UNATTENDED**. If your child is not in your car when it is time to dismiss, please pull around again to keep the cars flowing smoothly.
- 9. Be sure to keep the driveway clear so that buses can pass through to the bus lane.
- 10. After starting your engine, proceed and merge slowly.
- 11. **Refrain from using cell phone for any purpose during the dismissal process.** This is unsafe for the children as well as the staff members who are on duty.
- 12. Follow directives of staff members and crossing guards. Watch for children at all times!

Dismissal will be quick and efficient if everyone adheres to these procedures. Most importantly, we will be certain that all children are dismissed safely. Thank you in advance for your cooperation!

Type to Learn 4 is the product that WCS has chosen to provide keyboarding instruction and practice for our students. Type to Learn is available for use at school <u>and</u> home. Students may work at home and it will automatically sync with school. Visit

http://ttl4.sunburst.com/downloads/#FullVersions and download the appropriate version for your computer. To download, click on the link and choose **SAVE** rather than open or run. After downloading, right-click on the zipped file and choose Extract. Double-click on the extracted file to launch the installer. Click "Next" through the few prompts. Installation is very straightforward. Once installed, launch the application by clicking Type to Learn 4 in your Start menu or desktop shortcut.

For this reason, we seek peer models with typical development for our Early Childhood program. This program focuses primarily on character development, including the development of social skills, language skills, and personal skills. The early childhood theme-based classroom setting encourages academic, social, language, fine motor, gross motor, and cognitive development of all children through the use of play and other developmentally appropriate activities.

We are now accepting applications for our Early Childhood Programs for the 2014-2015 school year. This is an opportunity for your 3, 4, or 5 year old to become a typical peer in a preschool classroom. As some of our peers return each year, we may have limited openings in some classrooms. Our enrollment of peer models is designed to match/complement our enrollment of children with special needs and is therefore based on a variety of factors such as gender and age. Please note that, to be eligible for Williamson County's Early Childhood Program, you must reside in the Williamson County School zone, and be able to transport your child to/from school as preschool peers are not eligible for WCS bus services.
