# **History of Kenrose Elementary**

Kenrose Elementary is part of the Williamson County Schools (WCS) district. WCS is a K-12 system with 41 school sites - 9 high schools, 8 middle schools, 23 elementary schools, and 1 K-8 school. Currently, a new high school and combined K-8 school campus is being constructed on the northeast corner of Nolensville Road and York Road intersection in the town of Nolensville. The schools are projected to open in the fall of 2016. Approximately 34,000 students were enrolled in WCS during the 2013-2014 school year. The district expects student enrollment to continue burgeoning as families consistently choose Williamson County for its high-achieving and award winning schools.

Kenrose Elementary opened in the fall of 1999. Kenrose was built on land donated by the Kennon family. The name "Kenrose" is a composite of the surname "Kennon" and the family matriarch's first name "Rose". The school colors are red and yellow, and the mascot is the cardinal. The mascot is called "KC" for "Kenrose Cardinal", and it is known to make appearances at school events. Kenrose serves students in Kindergarten through 5th grade and is proud to have one of the most diverse student populations in the district. Kenrose was designated a Tennessee Reward School in 2012, 2013, and 2014, which means it is ranked in the top 5% of Tennessee schools. During 2014 Kenrose was nominated by the State of Tennessee to be a National Blue Ribbon School. In November of that year, Kenrose received this honor at the National Blue Ribbon Schools Awards Ceremony in Washington, D.C.

The following is the description of Kenrose that can be found on the National Blue Ribbon Schools website:

"We are all in Tennessee, and our hearts are connected to the world" is the focal point of a mural that adorns the school library. These words reflect how the diverse culture of Kenrose Elementary School is celebrated. The vision of Kenrose Elementary school is to be known for happy and healthy students who excel in academics and the arts. The school pursues the mission every day"partnering with our diverse community to provide a safe and nurturing learning environment where we are committed to educating, inspiring, and empowering tomorrow's leaders." Tremendous growth, mobility, and diversity characterize Kenrose. Many students move to our school from other countries or have parents who were born abroad. The school strives to meet each student's academic. emotional, and social needs, enabling them to reach their potential and find their place within the caring Kenrose community and beyond. The school sets high expectations for all members of the Kenrose family. Students and adults are encouraged to identify, develop, and share their unique talents, including leadership. Teachers utilize differentiated instructional strategies to address the needs of all learners. Technology and hands-on activities engage students and enhance learning. The school's Parent Teacher Organization and extensive volunteer and community support are integral to its success. Kenrose believes it is an honor and a privilege to serve children. The school's vision, mission, and beliefs are captured by the words of our tagline, "Educating, Empowering, Inspiring . . . We are Kenrose!"

#### Kenrose PTO

The Kenrose Elementary PTO (Parent Teacher Organization) works in coordination with the school's administration to enhance the education of students by supporting programs and events, assisting teachers and staff, and fundraising. Families, teachers, and staff are encouraged to join the PTO. PTO Membership will be open and free to all families attending Kenrose. Membership will allow you access to an online directory via MySchoolAnywhere.com that can be accessed online and printed at home.

#### PTO Membership

The Kenrose Elementary PTO is composed of a 13-member Executive Board and the General PTO membership. Families can join the PTO by submitting a hard copy enrollment form or registering online. Ten of the 13 members of the Executive Board are elected to their positions by the General PTO membership.

Benefits of PTO membership:

#### **General PTO Meetings**

General PTO (GPTO) meetings are held 2-3 times a school year.—Definitive dates and times of the meetings will be communicated at least 5 days in advance. Matters required to come before the General PTO membership include:

- Approval of the annual budget.
- Changes to the budget greater than \$1500 per budget line item.
- Changes to the By-Laws.
- Election of Executive Board members.

#### **PTO Executive Board**

The PTO Executive Board consists of 13 positions, each with responsibilities over different areas of the PTO. All positions are elected into office, except the principal, the teacher representative, and the member at large. The teacher representative is a designee of the principal. Our current teacher representative is Mrs. Tressa Tuck. The member-at-large is an advisory position voted on by the newly elected Executive Board. The member-at-large is a non-voting position. # **Fundraising**

#### Build the Nest & Family Fun Night

The Kenrose PTO holds one main fundraising event for the year. Our parents have indicated a preference for a check writing campaign rather than traditional fundraisers, such as selling cookies or wrapping paper.

The Build the Nest (BTN) campaign is *the* fundraiser for Kenrose. It is held at the beginning of September and runs for two weeks. Aninformational flyer will come home with each child and be posted in the Bird's Eye View. Flat contribution guidelines are suggested, and contributions of all amounts are greatly appreciated. Participation in BTN is not mandatory. The PTO would like families to donate at their comfort levels.

The Build the Nest Campaign culminates ina school-wide celebration called Family Fun Night (FFN). This is an event for the entire family. There are many activities, food, and an auction. Most of the activities and rides are free, but some do require the purchase of tickets. Tickets and food can be pre-ordered or purchased at FFN. Families are strongly advised to pre-order meals. Meals can be purchased on-site, but there has been less supply than demand every year.

FFN is a great opportunity for businesses to advertise through a sponsorship or donation for this big night.

### **Skate Nights**

The Kenrose PTO hosts a skate night at the Brentwood Skate Center once a month. The skate center is located at 402 Wilson Pike Circle, Brentwood, Tennessee, 37027. Their phone number is (615) 373-8611. Skate nights are usually held from 4:30 pm to 6:30 pm. Upcoming skate nights are posted/announced in advance.

Brentwood Skate Center generously gives a percentage of the entry fee paid by each student back to the school. Students are invited to come meet friends and skate! Each student should check-in with the PTO volunteer present at each skate night. The sign-in sheet informs the skate center of how many Kenrose students attended.

#### **Spirit Weekends**

Kenrose has partnered with several local restaurants to host Kenrose Spirit Weekends that will offer families various options to participate.

### **Publix Shopping Cards**

Publix is a Kenrose PTO fundraising partner. Kenrose families who shop at Publix can have a percentage of their purchases donated to the PTO by using a Publix shopping card designated for Kenrose. Anyone may participate by requesting a scan card (consider relatives and friends!), which is scanned by the cashier during check out. The PTO always has plenty of these shopping cards available at PTO events. Please ask if the cards are not obviously visible. If a card is forgotten at check-out, just ask the cashier; they keep all of the local cards available at every register!

### **Box Tops for Education**

Kenrose PTO participates in collecting Box Tops for Education. The labels are found on various food product packages. Cut the labels from the product packages and collect them. Submit the collected Box Tops to your child(ren)'s teacher on Spirit Fridays. Box Top totals are tracked for each classroom and winners are announced at the end of the school year. #### **Volunteers**

#### **Volunteers**

Kenrose PTO is a community made up of exceptional volunteer parents/families. New parents are strongly encouraged to volunteer. Parents enjoy being part of the Kenrose family. Due to the numerous events the PTO hosts throughout the year, the PTO needs many volunteers in varying capacities, including but not limited to:

- Room Parents
- Servers for teacher/staff luncheons
- Baking and/or purchasing desserts for teacher/staff luncheons
- Book Fair Cashiers and student helpers
- Setting up and taking down events (chairs, tables, etc.)
- Working booths/rides at Family Fun Night.

In the best interests and protection of WCS students, WCS has defined three levels of school volunteers to correspond with levels of volunteer activities. In order to volunteer at Kenrose, parents must complete the School Volunteer Application and Confidentiality Agreement form. This form may be obtained from the Kenrose front office or at <a href="http://www.wcs.edu/wp-content/pdf/Volunteer/VolunteerApplication.pdf">http://www.wcs.edu/wp-content/pdf/Volunteer/VolunteerApplication.pdf</a>. Completion of this form is required for all levels of volunteer work in the school. Some Volunteers will want to do volunteer activities which require a Tier 3 volunteer badge, the most thorough vetting process. Please see information on Tier 3 volunteers below. Parents are welcome to volunteer in school without being a Tier 3 volunteer. Tier 1 and Tier 2 volunteers are required to sign-in and wear a visitor sticker while on school property. All visitors, including all levels of volunteers, must sign in and out at the front office.

#### Tier 3 Badges

A Tier 3 volunteer badge is *not* required to volunteer at Kenrose but *is* required in many situations, including chaperoningelementary field trips. The PTO is responsible for making Tier 3 volunteer badges. To obtain a Tier 3 badge, volunteers have to complete the School Volunteer Application and Confidentiality Agreement and be fingerprinted. The cost for fingerprinting services is \$40, and the applicant is responsible for this fee. Please contact the Kenrose PTO if assistance is needed with the fingerprinting fee. About two weeks after fingerprints are submitted, volunteers should contact their intended school site to confirm approval. The contact at Kenrose is Mrs. Julie Lankford, the assistant principal. The PTO contact is Ms. Meredith Oxborough. Meredith.oxborough@gmail.com. WCS will not notify approved applicants. WCS will only contact applicants if there is an issue with their application. Approved applicants can come to school during

PTO Hours or contact the PTO to schedule an appointment. Be camera ready as a photo will be taken. Tier 3 volunteers are encouraged to wear their badges at all times while on school property. Visitor stickers from the front office are used in place of Tier 3 badges for volunteers who forget their badge.

#### Classroom Volunteers

Parents are encouraged to help in the classroom. The grade level and teacher will dictate how much and what level of help is needed. Every class will need a Room Parent(s). Room Parents work with and serve as a liaison between the teacher and parents of his/her students. Room Parents receive training at the beginning of the school year from the Room Parent Coordinator. The Room Parent Coordinator also communicates with Room Parents throughout the school year to share PTO communications and upcoming events that may require classroom assistance. Some of the responsibilities of a Room Parent are:

- Plan and organize parties (Fall, Winter and Valentine's) throughout the year.
- Organize volunteers as needed by the teachers within the classroom (this will be more so in the lower grades).
- Plan and organize festivities for Teacher/Staff Appreciation Week.
- Plan teacher birthday celebrations.
- Assist the teacher in coordinating parent volunteers for classroom needs.

Room parent(s) are not affiliated with nor an extension of the PTO Executive Board. Any monies collected by room parents are independent of the PTO and outside of the PTO's purview. The Room Parent Coordinator reports to the Volunteer Coordinator who is an Executive Board member *and* the liaison between the PTO Executive Board and the Room Parent Coordinator.

#### **Newcomers Breakfast**

The Newcomers Breakfast is an event coordinated by the Kenrose Counseling Committee and PTO to provide families new to Kenrose with important information forstarting the school year. Newcomer families have children who will be attending Kenrose for the first time, but will not be entering as Kindergarteners. The Newcomers Breakfast is scheduled for July 28, 2015.

#### Back to School Bash

The Back to School Bash is the celebratory kick-off for the new school year. This event provides opportunity for families to find-out class assignments and meet teachers. Back to School Bash is scheduled for August 4, 2015.

### **Boo Hoo Breakfast**

The Boo HooBreakfast is an event sponsored by the PTO. After taking their kindergarteners to class, parents are invited to a continental breakfast to celebrate the significant milestone. Younger siblings are welcome!

## **Book Fair**
